Missing Persons Case

Kerry Krueger Obrien has been missing since December 6th, 1989. Our department has committed numerous man hours and resources during 2015 in an effort to bring this case to a resolution. The Krueger truck was located in Cedar Rapids Iowa and ultimately back to Wisconsin, since the Cadaver dogs indicated on the vehicle. The vehicle was processed at the Wisconsin State Crime Lab. Several interviews have been conducted in an effort to develop leads. This case remains opens and active.

Plaza Theater Burglary

The Detective Bureau received DNA evidence from the Wisconsin State Crime Lab regarding the evidence that was submitted in 2014. Search Warrants and Subpoenas were issued for additional information obtained on a person of interest. The new information is currently being examined and investigated. We will continue to work on new leads in an effort to bring this case to a conclusion.

2016 Investigations

Family Trouble

Patrol conducted an extensive investigation concerning a possible overdosing complaint. The original report states that a sibling reported that his father was physically abusive and over medicating his mother. Medical records were reviewed and an investigation was conducted. It was determined that the mother was accidentally over medicating herself. Several solutions were offered to the family and the mother was removed from the home so appropriate care could be provided.

Death Investigation

A welfare check was requested by the sister of our victim. The victim was found deceased in the apartment. The Racine County Medical Examiner was notified and arrived on scene. An investigation was conducted and it was determined the victim had been drinking prior to his death. Victim arrived at home and ingested a prescribed Drug, which was a contributor to his death. The Medical Examiner determined that the combined effects of Alprazolam, Ethanol and positional asphyxia were the cause of this accidental death.

Retail Theft Menards

The Detective Bureau received information from the Elkhorn Police Department that they were investigating a subject responsible for several retail thefts in the area. Elkhorn PD turned over several items that were removed from the City of Burlington Menards Store. Contact was made with Menards and it was confirmed that several of the items were stolen from their location. Subject was arrested for Retail Theft.

Sexual Assault

A subject spent the night drinking at a local establishment. He returned home and continued drinking with a couple of friends from his past. Subject passed out in the bathroom in a compromising situation. Subject thought he was raped due to the visible biological fluids present. An investigation was conducted, several pieces of evidence were secured and witnesses/suspects were interviewed. It was determined that the subject was highly intoxicated and was not sexually assaulted. The facts were presented to our alleged victim and the complaint was withdrawn.

Fraud

Our victim reported that she was a victim of Identity Theft. When she submitted her 2014 Tax Return she was notified by the IRS that someone had already received a tax refund in her name. During the investigation it was determined that our victim had utilized several web based tax services and entered her personal information. Due to the complexities Tax Return Identity Fraud, we notified the IRS of her complaint. Several victims in our city reported their tax returns had been manipulated. In each case, the IRS was notified and given the information necessary for them to conduct a thorough investigation. The unidentified suspects use fraudulent bank accounts in order to receive the funds and use public computer access to file the fraudulent tax returns.

Theft by Embezzlement

The Patrol Division received a complaint from a local excavating company that two employees were using company funds for personal use. The suspects were hired to manage the financial responsibilities of the business. An extensive investigation was conducted and numerous questionable transactions were found. The suspects were interviewed and provided some justification for the expenditures. Our complaint states that over \$83,000.00 was unaccounted for in the business account and the suspects attempted to justify \$8500.00 of the total amount. Subpoenas were issued to local banks and charges were submitted to the Racine County District Attorney's Office.

Sexual Assault

An adult female stated that she was sexually assaulted in her secured apartment. Our victim stated that she invited a male subject to her apartment after meeting him on web based dating service. The victim informed her case worker that she had been assaulted by the male subject. The case worker advised our alleged victim not to have any more contact with anyone she met on the internet, but she continued to do so. The facts were presented to the Racine County District Attorney's Office and charges were declined, since our victim continued to have sexual encounters with males she met on the internet.

Sexual Assault of a Child

Our victim was a fifteen year old female and had multiple contacts with a twenty one year old male subject over the internet. The male subject was in the Navy at the time of the sexual assault. Sexual contact occurred in Elkhorn and in Burlington before authorities were notified. The male subject was identified by internet records and by the credit card he used to pay for the motel rooms. During the investigation, it was determined that the male subject had a history of this type of activity. The US Navy conducted their own investigation, and the subject was indicted by a Federal Grand Jury. Federal charges are pending and the male subject is currently incarcerated and awaiting trial.

Fraud by Check

A local business was a victim of a fraud when two male subjects purchased nearly \$2000.00 worth of items using a counterfeit check out of Michigan. An alert clerk realized something was suspicious and obtained a license plate from the offending vehicle. The vehicle was identified as a stolen U-Haul van out of Chicago IL. A teletype was sent to area departments and the suspects were located in Delavan WI attempting to pass another counterfeit check at a local business. Suspects were taken into custody in Walworth County and our stolen merchandise was recovered and returned to our victim. Our department issued charges in Racine County and the suspects were transported back to our county. An extensive investigation was conducted and it was determined that our suspects were part of a major fraud group that has committed felonies in Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, New York and several other states. The Milwaukee and Chicago Divisions of the FBI were notified and they are currently examining the information provided to determine if they will open a federal case regarding the group.

Fraud by Credit Card

A subject entered a local bank and requested a \$5000.00 cash advance on a credit card. Subject presented a Drivers License that matched the credit card presented. The bank declined the first amount but approved a \$3000.00 cash advance. An alert bank employee watched the subject enter a second bank immediately after leaving their location. A call was placed to the second bank and the cash advance request was declined. Officers responded and sent out a teletype with the suspects information. Suspect then entered Kenosha County and attempted to receive another cash advance at a third bank. Subject was recognized by a bank employee through internal bank emails and the police were notified. After a short chase, the subject was taken into custody. It was determined that the subject was responsible for numerous incidents of credit card fraud throughout Wisconsin. Suspect failed to appear after posting bond and felony warrants have been issued.

Armed Robbery

A local cellular phone store was a victim of an armed robbery. Two black males entered the store and ordered the employees to comply at gun point. Several thousand dollars of merchandise was taken and the subjects left in a newer Chevrolet Traverse. The suspects were captured on store video and the vehicle was identified by video surveillance near the crime scene. A teletype was sent to area departments and two days later our department was notified by Waukesha Police that they our suspects in custody. The suspects attempted to commit a second robbery in Waukesha and were apprehended. Search incident to arrest, officers located merchandise in the vehicle that was taken from our incident. The vehicle was identified as being a 2015 Chevrolet Traverse rented out of Massachusetts and suspects were from Chicago IL. Due to the large amount of cellular phone store robberies, the FBI was contacted and the suspects will be facing federal charges.

Community Activities

During 2016, Officers assisted and participated in the following community activities: Safety Town, Annual Bike to School Day, Torch Run, Community Block Party, Polar Plunge, Trunk or Treat, Stuff the Squad and Shop with a Cop.
