NOTABLE 2018 INVESTIGATIONS

Arson

City of Burlington Police responded to check on an individual that had made suicidal comments. Responding officer noted the strong smell of burning material but was unable to contact with party. Entry was made into the residence under the Community Caretaker doctrine, as there was concern for the welfare of the individual. It was found that the intoxicated party had started several fires throughout the residence in an attempt to harm themselves.

Motor Vehicle Accident / Possession of Controlled Substance

City of Burlington Police received a call regarding a possible accident where a person was ejected from a vehicle and the vehicle left the scene. The ejected party was transported to a medical facility but succumbed to his injuries. The scene was processed for evidence with the assistance of the Wisconsin State Patrol. The driver was located and arrested for possession of controlled substance. The details of the incident were forwarded to the Racine County District Attorney for charging consideration.

Arson

City of Burlington Fire and Police Departments were dispatched to the 300 block of West Chestnut Street for a garage fire. The Racine County Arson Task Force was notified and an investigation was conducted. Through multiple interviews and the examination of evidence, the cause/source of the fire was determined. The details of the incident were forwarded to the Racine County District Attorney for charging consideration.

Stalking / Intimidation / Restraining Order Violation

City of Burlington Police received a call of a possible restraining order violation at a local business. The known suspect was observed leaving the scene on officer arrival but was taken into custody. As a result of an extensive investigation, numerous search warrants and subpoenas were served. Evidence was processed and the investigative reports were submitted to the Racine County District Attorney which issued over 70 counts/charges for violations to include: Knowingly Violate a Domestic Abuse Order, Bail Jumping, Stalking, and Intimidation of a Victim.

Fire

City of Burlington Police and Fire Departments were dispatched to McCanna Park/Rockland Lake for a brush fire. Upon arrival a larger area of brush and cattails was burning to the south and west of the pier. Several parties were in the area and were interviewed. The details of the incident were forwarded to the Racine County District Attorney for charging consideration.

Fraud

Information was received from a local financial institution regarding fraudulent checks being cashed totaling approximately \$10,000. The suspect in the case was identified. The details of the incident were forwarded to the Racine County District Attorney for charging consideration.

Fraud

Unknown person falsely represented themselves to the elderly victim. The unknown person posed as a serviceman and established an on-line relationship with the victim. The victim provided the unknown party with funds. Through the issuance of multiple search warrants and subpoenas, several involved parties in the United States and overseas, were identified. The Federal Bureau of Investigations was contacted and assisted in the continuing investigation.

Embezzlement

A local business contacted Police to report the theft of cash by an employee, which had been occurring for some time. The business owner was able to determine that a significant amount of cash was taken. Though the use of video surveillance, the business identified an employee, who later confessed to the crime.


Burglary

The City of Burlington Police were contacted by a local auto repair business owner, when they interrupted a burglary in progress to their shop. The witness provided a description of a vehicle and driver. Investigators followed numerous leads as they developed. The department became aware of several other burglaries and thefts to similar businesses in southeast Wisconsin and throughout multiple states. Ultimately a stolen vehicle was recovered and several suspects were identified. The details of the incident were forwarded to the Racine County District Attorney for charging consideration.

Theft

A local business contacted the Police after a female entered the business stating that she left an item in the store. As the employee searched for the item, the female stole the cash box. The incident was recorded on the video surveillance system. An investigation was conducted and a suspect was identified. The matter was referred to the municipal court.

K-9



Zander is a three year old German Shepherd, who was born in Germany. Zander is the department's third K9 succeeding the two previous K9's, Nando and Natz, who were handled by Sergeant John Fisher (retired).

Zander and his handler, Officer Eric Willms, went to an initial five week training course at Steinig-Tal Kennels in Campbellsport, WI and graduated in October 2018. Officer Willms and Zander must maintain a minimum of 16 of maintenance training every month. The unit trains during their normal patrol shift at various locations throughout the city, at Steinig-Tal Kennels and at various sites throughout Racine County with the Racine County Sheriff's Office K9 teams. Officer Willms and Zander also attend a yearly week long re-certification course at Steinig Tal Kennels.
